From the Director's Desk

Let me begin this note by thanking all of the summer staff who helped us achieve so much over the last few months. At Myrtleville House Valerie Garret and Ashley Rodriguez ensured that all of the summer campers had fun learning experiences while making new friends along the way. Kendra Gerber applied herself to bringing more order to the Charlotte Street collection getting material rendered into the catalogue and carrying on the digitization process.

We are moving toward packing the collection in an orderly manner by applying for grants to hire four contract staff for a ten month period beginning in September. These people will help us prepare to move the collection to a new site as one becomes available.

Now that summer is slipping away and cooler autumn nights approach, the Museum will be switching gears to offer seasonal appropriate programming. The Harvest Fest will be held at Myrtleville House again this year and a new programme will be launched from this location in October. The Autumn Cemetery Tour will explore some of the more fascinating, and lesser known, burial grounds in Brant County. And don't forget that our Speaker Series continues on a monthly basis at Charlotte Street until November.

Another not-to-be missed favourite will be coming to town on September 21 as Doors Open Brant welcomes you to over 20 sites across both the city and county.
