#### PREFACE

Several years ago, I discovered the early Assessment Rolls of the Grand River Tract, Haldimand Township on Microfilm Reel 11 at the Kitchener Public Library, 85 Queen Street North, Kitchener, Ontario N2H 2H1 (519-743-6271). The kind librarians taught me how to photocopy this important early historical listing for people seeking their early non-native ancestors who lived along the Grand River.

Besides listing in alphabetical order the landowners on the Assessment Rolls of the years 1816 and 1818 through 1822, I have also defined the "Haldimand Deed", "Indian Lands Along the Grand River", "Gore District", and "Haldimand Township". the thirty-one answers to the queries of Robert Gourlay's (1778-1863) "Statistical Account of Upper Canada" gives us an insight to the farm life of Haldimand Township, Wentworth County.

Due to the early script and the faded ink markings, some of the acreage of arable, pasture or meadowlands for each owner were difficult to decipher. In the beginning first assessment rolls, the types of dwellings of landowners are listed as one storey or two storey, log, stone, or timber edifices, and the number of fireplaces are counted. Ownership of animals (cattle, horses, sheep, etc), farm implements (ploughs, harrows, etc.) and vehicles (wagons, carriages, etc.) are listed for taxation purposes. It was impossible to list of this detailed information in this publication.

It is interesting to note that many of the early Haldimand pioneers were loyalists in background and arrived at the Grand River area after the American revolution (1775-1783). Latter arrivals of the Americans were invited by the first Lieutenant Governor, Colonel John Graves Simcoe (1792-96) to assist in settling the wild virgin forests of Upper Canada.

#### GEOGRAPHICAL LOCATIONS ON ASSESSMENT ROLLS

#### A) GORE DISTRICT

On March 22, 1816, by Act 56, George III, C.19, the District of Gore was formed from parts of the West Riding of the County of York (Home District) and parts of the First Riding of the County of Lincoln and the County of Haldimand (Niagara District) separated to form the Gore District, which was divided into two new counties, Wentworth and Halton. The new district was named for Sir Francis Gore, the second Lieutenant Governor of Upper Canada (1806-1817). Major William Halton was his secretary, and Sir John Wentworth was Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia (1792-1808). Hamilton was to be the centre of the Gore District.

#### B) HALDIMAND DEED - INDIAN LANDS ALONG THE GRAND RIVER

From the years 1778 to 1786, Sir Frederick Haldimand (1718-1791) was Governor of Canada. To compensate the Six Nations for their homeland in New York and northern Pennsylvania and for their loyalty to the British Crown during the American Revolution, Governor Haldimand instructed Lieutenant Colonel John Butler of the Rangers to purchase land along the Grand River from the Mississaugas.

The Haldimand Land Grant (X015173) to the Six Nations, registered on March 20, 1795, granted six miles deep of land from each side of the Grand River beginning at Lake Erie to the end of the river.

After the Haldimand Treaty of October 1784, settlers were attracted to the beautiful Grand Valley. Captain Joseph Brant leased or sold certain sections of the land to help his people develop an agricultural society.

The sale of Grand River Indian lands to non-native settlers continued until January 1841, when the Six Nations surrendered to the government all of their remaining lands with the exception of their farmlands and about 20,000 acres which became the Six Nations Reserve.

C) HALDIMAND TOWNSHIP, WENTWORTH COUNTY, 1817
(now Brantford Township, Brantford and Paris in Brant County)

The part of the Indian Lands in Wentworth County known as "Haldimand Township" nearly follows today's outline of Brantford Township, including Brantford and Paris. The term "Indian Lands Township" was also used on legal documents - particularly in the 1830's.

One of the earliest records of the description and population of Haldimand Township is contained in Robert Gourlay's "Statistical report of Upper canada". On December 11, 1817, a meeting of settlers was called at the home of Frederick Yeoward, merchant, of Mount Pleasant. The replies about Haldimand Township were as follows:

- 1. Haldimand Township its length is estimated about twenty miles, commencing at Dundas Street. Its breadth is twelve miles, that is, according to the original Haldimand Grant, extending six miles from each side of the Grand River, or River Ouse.
- 2. It was settled in the year 1783 by Captain Joseph Brant (1742-1807) with the Five Nations (the Mohawk, Cayuga, Oneida, Onondaga and Seneca were the five component tribes of the Iroquois Confederacy, with the Tuscarora becoming the sixth Nation about 1722) and a few volunteer white people. The population of the white inhabitants of Haldimand Township is supposed to be 430, people of colour 30, and the number of the whole of the Five Nations about 1800 residing on the Grand River. The number of inhabited houses is supposed to be 60, exclusive of Indian dwellings.
- 3. There is one established church (Mohawk Chapel) with a clergyman attending occasionally.
  - 4. There is no medical practitioner.
- 5. There are five school-houses with teachers, average price per quarter 12/6.
  - 6. There are three stores.
  - 7. There are five taverns.
- 8. There are two grist mills, rate of grinding 1/12 per bushel; three saw mills, price of sawing 1/2 and the logs are required to be brought to the mill; the price of boards for one hundred feet one inch stuff 3/g; one carding machine, rate of carding wool 5 p per pound; one fulling mill.
- 9. The land of Haldimand Township is composed of a variety of soil, generally sandy loam, and much of it very fertile.

- 10. The kinds of timber are various and consist of white oak, white pine, sugar maple, beech, black oak, red oak, elm, basswood, ash, butternut or white walnut, hickory, wild cherry, black walnut, chestnut.
- 11. Plaster of Paris in abundance and of good quality also salt springs equal to those of Onondaga, and which, if worked would supply the upper part of the Province at about 17/6 per barrel.
  - 12. No building stones have as yet been discovered.
- 13. Bricks have been made this summer and sold for one point five pound per thousand.
- 14. Lime has been burned and sold at one-third per bushel, at the kiln, of good quality.
- 15. Wages: of Blacksmiths, for the working of iron for Husbandry uses are 7 1/2 per pound; masons and carpenters have generally 7/6 per day, boarding and lodging included.
- 16. The wages of common labourers, by the Year are from twenty pounds to twenty-five pounds trinum (thrice yearly), per winter month two point 10 pounds; summer month three point fifteen pounds and the price of labour in harvest is five per day, boarding and lodging included. A servant girl can be had for 5/ per week including spinning and house work.
- 17. The price of mowing grass is 3/9 per day and of reaping and cradling grain at 5/ per day, in each case boarding and lodging is included.
- 18. The cost of clearing and fencing five acres of woodland per contract is estimated at fifteen pounds, but great parts of this township consists of Plane Lands, the expense of clearing and fencing which is trifling and estimated at L7.40, boarding not included.
- 19. A good work horse, four years old, is estimated at fifteen pounds. A good cow is estimated at five pounds. A yoke of working cattle, five years old, estimated at fifteen pounds. A sheep is valued at 10/.
- 20. Average quality of wool is sixty-three and one-half pounds per fleece and the price is at present 2/6 per fleece.
- 21. Ordinary time of turning cattle out to pasture is the first of May and taking them to stable, the first of November.
- 22. Sleighing season commences about the first of January and continues about eight weeks. Time of ploughing usually commences on the twenty-fifth of April.

- 23. The time of sowing grain is from the first of September to the twentieth and the time of harvest is usually the first of August.
- 24. The quantity of wheat sown upon an acre is generally 1 1/4 bushels & the average yield is twenty bushels per acre.
- 25. The quality of the pasture is such that a summer's run of an ox is estimated at two hundredweight and for dairy purposes might be much improved by the use of Plaster of Paris; the present price of butter is ten d. per pound and of cheese 7 1/2.
- 26. New lands are generally put in with winter wheat and seeded down timothy and clover, in which they will continue from three to five years and when broken up again will produce either wheat, rye, or oats, but are usually put in with wheat. The usually way of putting in grain on the Planes is by ploughing and harrowing, and on timberland the first crops are only harrowed in.
- 27. Land cultivated on Shares is generally let for one-third of the produce of grain and hay the grain for seed and teams and all expenses of management are usually found and paid by the tenants. In this Township, not much land is let on shares.
- 28. The land within Haldimand Township is granted by Government to the Five Nations of Indians some part of the same being leased by their late agent Captain Joseph Brant to the present white settlers for the term of 999 years at 7/6 per acre for the whole of that period.
- 29. There is no land for sale, but leases for 21 years may yet be obtained from the Indians on very moderate terms.
- 30. The state of roads is generally good but capable of improvement at a small expense. The Grand River or Ouse is at present navigable for rafts from a considerable distance above the Township down to its confluence with Lake Erie, and a great part of this extent may be navigated with boats or vessels of considerable burthen (burden); which water conveyance might be much further obtained, extended and improved by widening and deepening the Grand River in certain places.
- 31. The Indians progressing the fee of Haldimand Township as tenants in Fee Tail (limited to a particular class of heirs) only, but not in Fee Simple (an estate of inheritance in land, either absolute and without limitation to any particular class of heirs), prevents them from alienating the land, of consequence retards its improvement.

This document was signed at the home of Frederick Yeoward, merchant, Mt. Pleasant, Haldimand Township, Wentworth County on December 11, 1817. The principal inhabitants and the Chiefs of the Five Nations had been invited to this meeting.
